Welcome to the Pack! Please use this as a guide to help you track your pup's progress.

spu	Heel	A proper heel is when your dog's shoulder is at your heel and you are able to hold the loose leash with only your fingertips. Practice doing circles, figure eights, serpentine and in crowds.
	Sit	There should be no hesitation when given the command.
	Stay	Practice stay by walking around and stepping over your dog. Play the sounds of dogs barking and doorbells on YouTube to test their stay.
	Come	There should be no hesitation when given the command. Practice calling your dog out of play to come and sit in front of you.
	Place	Any change in height or texture. Practice on benches, picnic tables, bath mats, grass vs. concrete, etc.
	Down	Flat, all the way down on command!

Hold the heel position without a leash attached.
When the handler stops the dog should sit without being prompted.
When approaching a curb or other barrier the dog will sit at the handler's side either when prompted or automatically.
Your dog will hold the stay until released or called, even when the handler has stepped out of sight for an extended period.
Just like "stay" but usually more temporary such as at a door.
Holding an extreme heel up and down stairs very slowly; literally one step at a time.
• "Walking the Plank."
Responding to basics using only hand commands, not verbal.
II Done To cease barking.
During free time the dog will move closer to the handler but not necessarily all the way. It allows for freedom while still respecting the handler's control of the situation.
Release whatever is in the mouth immediately.
Ignore the distraction or stimuli that is indicated.

Crate	Calmly entering and exiting the crate on command and maintaining a quiet dignity while inside.
Muzzle	Allowing the muzzle to be put on without fuss and wearing it calmly.
Door Manners	Sitting at a threshold and waiting until being told to move through.
Mealtime Manners	Waiting on place while meals are being prepared and waiting to be called to their bowl; waiting on place while the people are eating.
Temperament Test	Meeting and taking a walk with other dogs in the pack without incident.
Playdate	Appropriate free play with other dogs in the pack without incident.
Group Class	Attending a group class with the pack.
Vet	A visit to the animal hospital without incident.
Medicine	Taking a pill without a bribe.
Shopping	Going to a store and "shopping" with a handler.
Tandem Walk	Walking on a coupler with another dog in the pack.
Restaurant	Displaying good manners and holding place while the people are eating.
Grooming Manners	Nails, teeth, brush, bath, clip, etc.
Alternate Handler	Minding good manners while on a walk with another handler.
Nighttime Privileges	Sleeping free in the house without an accident or incident.
House Privileges	Staying free in the house while people are out without an accident or incident.
Cat Manners	Co-existing peacefully with a cat without any barriers.
Kid Manners	Co-existing peacefully with a child without any barriers.
